



Auschwitz Foundation Research Grants

Regulations

Art. 1 - The Auschwitz Foundation, foundation of public utility, awards two research grants in honour to the victims of Nazi concentration camps and killing centres: the 'Auschwitz Foundation Research Grant' (since 2012) and the 'Auschwitz Foundation – Jacques Rozenberg Research Grant'* (since 2023).

Art. 2 – The 'Auschwitz Foundation Research Grant' and the 'Auschwitz Foundation - Jacques Rozenberg Research Grant'* can be awarded annually and have for purpose to support two researchers in their historical or cultural research project. The projects must contribute significantly to the knowledge of:

- *National Socialism and the Third Reich (history, politics, economy, culture and ideology).*
- *Nazi crimes, Nazi genocides and the systems and processes which have given rise to them.*
- *The consequences of these events for society and collective memory in the present.*
- *Genocides and mass crimes of the 20th century.*
- *Similar events in the past.*

Art. 3 – The 'Auschwitz Foundation Research Grant' and the 'Auschwitz Foundation – Jacques Rozenberg Research Grant'* both amount to €3,000. These amounts can not be divided or can not be increased if a research grant has not been awarded for one of more year(s). Each publication of an awarded research work should clearly mention that it was awarded a Auschwitz Foundation Research Grant.

Art. 4 – Each candidate must submit their application through the dedicated application form on the website of the Auschwitz Foundation (<https://www.auschwitz.be/en/>). Each application must contain all the requested information.

The application deadline has been set annually on 15 January.



Art. 5 – Entries will be presented to a panel of experts for evaluation. The jury will decide on the awarding of the research grants, based on these expert reports. The jury consists of members of the Auschwitz Foundation executive board, together with anyone else whose participation is considered useful by the board. The jury's decision is final and cannot be contested.

Art. 6 - The Auschwitz Foundation executive board is competent for all matters not foreseen by these regulations.
